

Wirtland Ohio March 10 1839

Dear Sister it is with pleasure that I now embrace the opportunity of writing a few lines to you to inform you of my health which is very good at present, and hope these few lines will find you enjoying the same blessing. I received your friendly letter and was very sorry to hear that Sister Susan's health was so poor. I should have wrote before but have been careless or negligent about it not having had a convenient opportunity to do it. Give my love to Mother and Frank and Susan and tell them that I should be very glad to see them but when I shall I know not perhaps never more in this world although I Design to come over next fall but if sister Susan is as low as you wrote I think it will be doubtful if she continues until then but tell her that I hope to meet on the blissful shores of heaven tell her to put her trust in the redeemer of sinners who died that we might live we are only placed here to prepare for another and a better world let us then strive to be found faithful unto our Service and our own souls and then when we have past through this unfriendly world we shall all unite again oh my dear Sister do remember these things and strive to impress
